President's Letter, August 2010

une and July were not good months for many neighbors because of issues with the City's sewers/water mains. The damage incurred by residents was financial and emotional, and compounded by the multiple instances of water/sewer infiltration. The residents affected called 311 to report the problem. One resident had a sink hole, another neighbor with 12" of unrecognizable, smelly ick in the basement on 3 separate occasions. Initiated by residents, a meeting was scheduled for August 3rd with City Council persons and Water Department representatives. On a related note, check with your household insurance provider regarding coverage for sewer water damage/back-up drain damage.

The new school year is almost here and Southwest High School (located at the southeast corner of our Homes Association at 65th and Wornall) will be home to over 1,000 students this fall. There has been a flurry of preparation and a grass-roots volunteering of neighbors from surrounding homes associations, nearby merchants, churches, school board members, city officials and families of students. All have been working together to ensure a smooth and safe transition: from parking and transportation committees to mentoring and welcoming committees. There are over 100 volunteers. Personally, I am on two of the eight committees and I have been impressed with the level of commitment and willingness to get things done.

As mentioned in previous newsletters, our Homes Association website is under construction. Board member Ryan Felton is leading the committee. Our goal is to have the site launched by the end of the year and have real-time updates to the home page.

Our security patrol officers want to remind all of us to be a "harder target" for crime. This means keeping garage doors closed, porch lights on at night, installing motion detector lighting, trimming back hedges/shrubs around windows, and not leaving valuables in your car. I recently heard about an important crime stopping situation. Because a resident let his neighbors know that he was out of town, the attentive neighbors noticed suspicious persons at the house and called 911. Sure enough, a crime



All parties involved were allowed to express their opinions and frustrations. Communication lines between the Water Department and Greenway Field residents have become more transparent and open. Our 4th District council people are keeping the Greenway Fields residents informed as to the City's plans for replacing the old tile sewer pipes in phase 3B.

We all realize that we are dealing with 80 year old pipes, but basic city services are also expected. More information will be forthcoming in upcoming newsletters.

The folks at Boulevard finally got tired of being part of the problem. So, with the support of local companies and community organizations, they came up with a solution—Ripple Glass.

Ripple has constructed a state-ofthe-art processing plant here in KC, and placed dedicated glass recycling containers throughout the metro area. Best of all, they've found a local customer that will convert the recycled glass into fiberglass insulation, saving enormous amounts of energy and dramatically lowering emissions while producing a product that saves still more energy. It's a great way to close the loop, protect the environment, support local businesses and even make homes more energy efficient. But it will only work with our help, if we get involved. 
