
ith all these wonderful spring and summer showers, it is easy to forget that water is a finite and valuable

resource. There are some easy ways to reduce the amount of water you use (and save on your water bill). Here are some quick tips:

- Run your dishwasher only when it is full (skip the pre-rinse cycle, especially if you rinse off your dishes in the sink before putting them in the dishwasher).
- Wash clothes in cold water and wash only full loads.
- Turn off the faucet while brushing your

teeth, shaving, or handling soap.

• Limit showers to 5–10 minutes.

The driveway. Ask your neighbor to park *his* car in *your* driveway.


Many burglars aren't familiar with your vehicle. If you don't have a willing neighbor, park your own car in the driveway if you can.

Monitor your home with your smartphone. A simple computer program like *iCam* and a couple of monitors can give you a view of your home while you're away. Other standalone cameras such as *Dropcam* operate on your home's Wi-Fi network to offer the same benefits. For less than \$200 you can have a system that works for you all the time, whether you're on vacation or not.

Do not change the positions of your drapes or blinds. We all are tempted, but if your house doesn't appear as it usually does, you again are advertising that you're not home.

Consider a free subscription to social media notification service, *Next Door (http://www.nextdoor.com)*. It is a limited member social media targeted directly to your neighborhood. Residents post things like suspicious cars, door to door salespeople, and break-in information. They also post fun stuff like Garage Sales and Services offered. The best part is the KCMO Police Officers who patrol our area are also on this network. They offer you a chance to know who they are and provide a forum for your questions or concerns.

So go ahead, put your lights on a timer, but do more. Have a secure home and have fun!
